

The Lion Man **Stories of The Fort**

Villagers called him the "Lion Man" and the children run away from him for fear that he would... eat them. Hordes of people would come in charabancs and on bicycles to see the Lion Man's animals at weekends and to savour all other delights of the Hoo Peninsula's holiday playground, Allhallows.

The war brought a temporary end to these festivities and closed down the Lion Man's zoo. So he set up home in a little cottage on the main road into the village and waited for peace to return. He never did start



up his zoo again and the villagers stopped calling him the Lion Man - and started calling him 'Swifty"- but Allhallows lived on as a holiday playground.

When did you first visit Slough Fort and what impressed you more about
