



Fort Fact




English Heritage designated the fort as a Grade Il listed building in 2009 in recognition of its unusually good state of preservation and for the way that it embodies both technological developments in armaments and coastal defence during the late C19 to early C20 as well as the changing views of the perceived defensive need on the north Kent coast at this time. The wing batteries have been listed separately, also since 2009, as a scheduled monument in recognition of their rarity.


Volunteer Story
