


Work never stops at Slough Fort and after the Christmas break, we had our first work day of 2020.

Heritage Walks



Recently, the Fort gained some funding to provide free heritage walks on the peninsular. Our first walk was held on Sunday 29th December and took us around Yantlet Creek where our guide Keith explained it's rich history. The creek was often used by smugglers as a way to avoid capture from the Crown. We then followed the coast around before cutting across the field to a decoy oil refinery. The concrete structure was used when enemy bombers were on raids over England. Oil was lit in the dummy structure to fool the bombers and to guide them away from the real location of the nearby refinery. All fifty tickets were allocated within 2 days of being available. Our next walk is already full and will take in the history of Isle of Grain and it's forts. Look out for our March walk on Sunday 10th March, where tickets will be allocated via TicketSource.
